Documentation is required to provide adeapte information thatestablishes the presence of a disability and the functional impact on major life activities ong with justification of the need for requested accommodations. Documentation must be recently accurately describe the current effects on the student. If documentation is inadequate in scope or contested does not support the presence of a disability and need for accommodation bisability. Services may reigner additional information.

The professional providing documentation for the student must be qealto diagnose the disability and recommend appropriate accommodation. The name, title, and professional credentials of the provider, including information about license or certification, area of specialization, and state in which the individual practice, must be clearly stated in the documentational is not appropriate for professionals to provide documentation members of their families. Il submitted documents should be on letterhead, typed, dated, signed, and otherwise legionals to provide documents and otherwise legionals.

A diagnosis alone will not necessarily establish disability status or warrant accommodations under state and federal laws. Accommodations must be necessary, reasonated expropriate. A clear link
